

- Start of Meeting at 10h20
- o Votes given to all R.C representatives.
- o Welcome by DDG Christina Covotsou Patroclou and presentation of agenda
- o 1) Budget:
- o Presentation of projected expenses for Rotarian year 2013-2014.
 - Objection by Paphos Aphrodite R.C as they felt that information regarding the amount transfer from previous year was not enough.
 - DDG Christina explained that accounts of last year were not presented yet, and did not really concern this year's budget.
 - RC Paphos Aphrodite also felt that since the amount in the bank covered projected expenditure then they are not prepared to approve a levy of €12.50 per person and that the amount should be revised if not forfeited altogether.
 - Several clubs requested to have information on the Conference budget and outcome. Again DDG Christina explained that accounts were not finalised therefore could not be presented but again, the conference results has nothing to do with Cyprus Rotary budget.
 - Voting of clubs on budget: approved with 17/18 R.C present. Club that voted against: R.C Paphos Aphrodite. Absent club: R.C Paphos.
 - Voting: 1 vote per club as per new directive.
 - o DDG Christina announced that the cost of €12.50 per Rotarian for the year 2013-14 will be covered by the surplus of the Rotary Conference in April. The total amount that will be covered is €12.50 X 800 Rotarians = €10.000.00

2) DG Visit:

- The general feeling for the first visit of the Governor in October is very good. He concentrated in the following points:
 - o Membership balance age, sexes, increase
 - o Service project
 - TRF contribution and "exploitation" of the Grants need of a Rotarian in each area to be trained how to fill out the Grant forms.
 - PR awareness
- Presentation of the current schedule for DG visit in January 2014

3) Polio Plys Fundraiser:

Suggestion for a polio fundraising event by R.C Nicosia Lefkothea on the 12th January 2013.
 Presentation by P.P Iacovos Costantinides.

4) RYLA in spring 2014:

- The idea this year, is to cut down the cost of accommodation and meals therefore there will be 2 meetings.
 - First one will cover the areas of Limassol, Paphos and Famagusta and the second one Nicosia and Kyrenia.
- o Rotary Clubs are requested in recruiting youth, either from Rotaract Clubs or other.

5) Rotary Peace Fellowship Visitor:

RPF Ioannis Sarikas who lives in Australia will be visiting Cyprus for two months, January &
 February. All Rotary Clubs will be requested to plan a date for a visit of Mr Sarikas to their clubs.

6) Shelter Box for Philippines:

- Suggestion by AG Litsa Aresti for Cyprus Rotary to offer 1 shelter box. Approved by 10 present clubs to cover the cost of STG£500.00 from Cyprus Rotary budget.
- Other clubs are encouraged to contribute in more shelter boxes for this purpose.

7) Other business:

- PDDDG Themis Themistocleous took the stand and talked about the Rotarians in Cyprus and the
 tendency to be a member of a Rotary Club rather than a Rotarian and stressed the difference
 between the two. This can be seen also from the cancellation of the Cyprus Conference for the
 second consecutive year and urged all Rotarians to show true interest in Rotary and its cause.
- PAG Elena Tanou asked all Clubs to send her any press releases they have or will have from events they produce so that she makes sure they are put in all type of media.

What's Rotary

Rotary is a volunteer organization of business and professional leaders who provide humanitarian service, and help to build goodwill and peace in the world. There are approximately 1.2 million Rotary club members belonging to 34,000 Rotary clubs in more than 200 countries and geographical areas.

Founded in Chicago in 1905, Rotary celebrated 100 years of service in 2005. The Rotary Foundation has awarded more than US\$2.1 billion in grants, which are administered at the local level by Rotary clubs.

What is the purpose of Rotary?

Rotary clubs exist to improve communities through a range of humanitarian, intercultural and educational activities. Clubs advance international understanding by partnering with clubs in other countries. Rotary also encourages high ethical standards in all vocations.

What do Rotary clubs do?

Rotary clubs address critical issues at home and abroad by providing health care and medical supplies, clean water, food, job training, youth development, and education to millions of people in need. Examples of Rotary's focus areas include:

Polio Eradication - In 1985, Rotary International created PolioPlus – a program to immunize all the world's children against polio. To date, Rotary has contributed more than US\$1 billion and countless volunteer hours to the protection of more than two billion children in 122 countries. Rotary is currently working to raise an additional US\$200 million toward a US\$355 million challenge grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. These efforts are providing much needed polio vaccine, operational support, medical personnel, laboratory equipment and educational materials for health workers and parents. In addition, Rotary has played a major role in decisions by donor governments to contribute over \$6 billion to the effort. With its community-based network worldwide, Rotary is the volunteer arm of the global partnership dedicated to eradicating polio. Rotary volunteers assist in vaccine delivery, social mobilization and logistical help in cooperation with the national health ministries, the World Health Organization (WHO), UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Peace - In an effort to educate tomorrow's peacemakers and ambassadors, up to 110 Rotary World Peace Fellows are sponsored each year to study at one of the eight universities for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution. Since 2002, 431 fellows from over 75 countries have participated at a cost of more than \$23 million.

International Education - Rotary is the world's largest privately-funded source of international scholarships. Each year, about 1,000 university students receive Rotary scholarships to study abroad. Rotary clubs also coordinate a high school-age student exchange program that has sent nearly 8,000 students abroad for three months to a year.

Humanitarian Projects - Rotary clubs initiate thousands of humanitarian service projects every year. These volunteer-driven projects address the root causes of conflict, such as hunger, poverty, disease and illiteracy. **Literacy** - Rotary clubs work to improve literacy rates worldwide. A unique, Rotary-pioneered approach called the Concentrated Language Encounter (CLE) has proven very effective in resource-strapped developing countries. It was so successful in Thailand, that the Thai government adopted the program nationwide.

Water Management - Recognizing the importance of clean water, many Rotary clubs help to install wells and develop water treatment and distribution systems to increase access to fresh drinking water for communities in need, especially in developing countries

Public Relations Plan

Public Relations Plan

Main target:

To get more citizens aware, especially whose who leave in Nicosia area, about our club, and our activities. What is Rotary, who are the Rotarians, what does Rotary do. Specifically, we should try to overcome and to clarify a misunderstanding and a misperception that runs across a lot of people in Cyprus that Rotary is a kind of a "sect" (heresy). This is a quite negative approach from a lot of people in Cyprus that affects the expansion, the role and the function of our club and our organization in general, especially in Cyprus a country with citizens that have very strong bonds to their religion. Also, we should sick and aim to expose and to promote most of our major activities, through the media (local and national).

Use of media:

In our days the use of media, especially electronic media, is a very powerful, important and effective tool (and vehicle) in order to promote and to inform the public about our organizations and our club's activities. We are listing below some of our initial suggestions regarding the promotion of our club's activities through the media:

- Prepare and send press (news) releases to all media (electronic and printed) regarding our major activities.
- Arrange the participation of our President and/or other Board members to various local radio programs, in order to speak and to explain the role, the function and the importance of our organization and especially our Nicosia-Lefkothea club.
- Inform the media (especially some "key" media

persons and journalists) but also the public, in general, about our official web-side, so they can visit it and get the appropriate information. They could also have a link to our weekly electronic bulletin in order to follow our meeting activities and other general activities and projects of our club.

Events that could be attractive to the media:

We should organize specific events that are attractive both to the media and to the general public.

Such events could be "tea - afternoons", dinners, special "theme" nights, or special nights (parties) at a local night club (such event could be also attractive to younger people). We can also organize special events like a Christmas Gala dinner, a Carnival dance dinner, a Saint Valentine's Day special dinner, an Easter lunch day, out in the fields, with the traditional lamb "suvla", etc. We can invite one or two notable, expert speakers (according to specific subjects and fields) well known Doctor, or a well known media personality, to give a speech thus, organizing an event open to the general public. For all these events and activities we can always collaborate with other local clubs.

Local government officials:

We could arrange meetings of our Board Members with high positioned local government officials in order to inform them about our activities, our efforts to support and to help the society through our charity activities and events and to make them aware about our existence and our function, especially in the district of Nicosia. Such meetings will be largely covered by the media.
