Dear Past DG Karakannas DGE Kevork Mahdessian, DDG George Papaleontiou, Ags, Commissioner of the Environment Mr Theopemptou, Past Presidents, fellow Rotarians and Rotary friends,

I already knew at the beginning of this Rotary year that being President of the Rotary club Nicosia Aspelia rotary club would not be an easy task as the targets and goals are high due to the high standards set by very successful Past Presidents.

The goals of the club this year were:

- To improve membership with a target to sustain old members, induct new members and work towards expanding classification.
- > To Charter one Rotaract and at least one Interact club.
- To implement projects helping the communities locally and internationally covering all the areas of service.
- twinning with at least 2 new clubs: one in the district and one from another district
- To review the by Laws.
- Most importantly to promote Rotary image to the public through the Media and the internet.

My year as president started by the change-over lunch end of June 2010, having besides me a very strong team of directors and committee chairs.

In order to sustain old members we tried to make the meetings interesting by having high profile speakers. Ambassador Johnny Young, from the USA, Jullien Deruffe, from the French Embassy, Archaeologist Dr Despo Pilides, Marine Biologist Antonis Petrou, Economist Marios Mavrides were a few of the speakers that discussed current and interesting subjects.

We also had some of our members speaking about their professions or subjects relating to their professions, such as Rotarian Manfred Lange, Nitsa Kiliaris and former diplomat Walter Bopp. We also had District officials training our members on Rotary issues in general. Once a month we had evening fellowship outings that replaced our regular meetings. In addition we introduced happy hour outings once a month, early in the evening, for the members that missed the regular meetings.

We have inducted 2 new members Marina Theodotou that was pinned by our DGE Kevork Mahdessian and Dr Areti Demosthenous that was pinned by our DG at the Gala dinner in January 2011. We had one Rotarian transferring to Aspelia, from a Greek club, Vassilis Skronias Economic and Trade advisor at the Greek Embassy. This brought the number of new members to 3 under 3 new classifications. The membership director of the club Dr Savvas Omorphos did a survey for new classifications at the beginning of the year.

### **Rotary foundation**

- Our club is 100% sustaining member of the Rotary foundation by contributing USD 100 per member for more than 5 years. This year we continued the tradition by sending USD 4500.
- > The club secured one District Simplified Grant for our Dyslexia project of

- The club had an Exceptional representation at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Cyprus Rotary Conference, in October 2010,
- > This year we are giving 6 PHF. We got 3 of them on Rotary Foundation date with double recognition points thus saving the club USD1500.

Our Service projects are based on an assessment of community needs

This year we had 3 major projects

1. Our recycling awareness project "Clean Cyprus – Let's make Cyprus a Cleaner Greener Place" project, in collaboration with Green dot Cyprus.

The official campaign was launched on 15<sup>th</sup> September during a Gala Dinner and in collaboration with Green Dot, under the auspices of Mrs Elsie Christofia, in the gardens of the Presidential Palace and in the presence of our District Governor. Awareness activities took place on various levels by the environmental chair Dr Manfred Lange who presented our project at the international biodiversity conference in Larnaca and also to our club and our Rotaractors. The awareness on recycling continued, by presentations to schools by Green Dot and Mr Loizos Afxentiou.

The beneficiaries of the project are unlimited since through the leaflet that was circulated during and after the Gala dinner, as well as with the media coverage, people became aware of the benefits of recycling.

In addition 2 schools were the immediate beneficiaries from the proceeds from the Gala dinner:

- The International American School in Cyprus and
- > the 4<sup>th</sup> Aglandjia primary school,

that received 40 Recycling bins each school for paper/Carton and PMD worth EUR 3923 and 2 composting bins donated by Blars – Mr Loizos Afxentiou

For the purpose of the campaign 2000 of PVC Plastic plagues were distributed during the launch of the campaign at Larnaca International airport on September 4 $^{\rm th}$  and after the press conference held at the Airport, in Ayia Napa on the same night.

The campaign had an excellent Media coverage in the press and in the main news of 2 TV stations.

The beneficiaries are the tourist and foreign visitors and the numbers are unlimited as the plagues stay in the z cars for a long time.

# 3 Dyslexia awareness booklet for Cyprus and Train the Trainer project

Research has shown, that worldwide a 10% of the population have dyslexia characteristics, with a 4% needing Special Education in order to learn read and write correctly. An important part of this problem in Cyprus is created by the ignorance of parents, teachers and the communities in general about the subject. As the problem is wide-spread in all parts of Cyprus a bi-communal approach involving the occupied part of the island as well was decided.

The Dyslexia Awareness Booklet was presented to the public for the first time at a press conference organised by the Cyprus Dyslexia Association, the Turkish Cypriot Dyslexia Association (KKDD), Rotary Club Nicosia Aspelia and Rotary Club Nicosia Sarayionou. The press conference was held at Chateau Status on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October.

Our club coordinated the project, translated the booklet into Turkish, and undertook the publishing of the Greek booklet and help with the distribution. We printed 2000 copies and we raised the money from 2 fund raising events, and from a District Simplified Grant

# **Train the Trainer project**

The Rotary Club of Nicosia-Aspelia and Nicosia Sarayonu, have taken the initiative to assist the Dyslexia Associations of the two communities in implementing training workshops for parents and teachers who handle or encounter Dyslexic children. The funding to materialise the project came from Engage NGO Support Centre and the Management Centre and sponsored by the UNDP-ACT by EUR 7000.

The beneficiaries are unlimited as the booklet is making teachers and the public in general aware of the learning difficulty and the train the trainer project is an on going training of parents.

I would like to thank PP Marianna Trokoudes for her efforts and the rest of the team that worked and supported the projects. Of course a big thank you to Ayse Cocart and PR Director Louisa Coudounaris and Masis de Parthogh, that helped with the media coverage.
