Bridge the education gap: take action during Rotary Literacy Month

Literacy is a special goal for Rotary because we know that literacy is a key factor in overcoming poverty and all that goes with it. Rotary considers it to be so important that it is one of the 6 areas of focus for The Rotary Foundations Future Vision – basic education and literacy.

The statistics are really shocking. UNESCO estimates there are 860 million illiterate adults in the world and about two thirds of them are women. Millions more are functionally illiterate, without the reading and writing skills necessary for everyday life. The United Nations has identified illiteracy as a major obstacle to economic, political, and social development.

UNESCO notes that literacy contributes to peace as it brings people closer to attaining individual freedoms and better understanding of the world, as well as preventing or resolving conflict. The connection between literacy and peace can be seen in unstable democracies or in conflict affected countries where it is harder to establish or sustain a literate environment.

Introduction of Speaker

P Loucas introduced Mr George Papageorgiou.

Speech

Mr Papageorgiou started his speech by stating that he was very excited to talk about Bitcoin which is conceived to save money during money transactions. The system works as does the central banks and banks in general except that the transactions are free of service charges and in particular making certain that money is transmitted with equal validity and information to all globally. For every interested party, Bitcoin has the same financial information, information is transmitted to all with the same way and every one sees the basic information given to all participants. It resembles the way gold works in its global market evaluation. The network transfer of banking data is through the Internet. Bitcoin transactions are far safer than the traditional Banks. Transactions of transfer of money are carried out with the same transparency in all countries and they do not expect service charges which all banks do due to their high expenses for running their bank services. Bitcoin operations cannot differ from country to country, as all is done based on same global information and common procedures equal to all through the internet. With Bitcoin you have more information you have more security and less corruption.

After the speech, many questions followed with the intention to understand this new way of money transaction. It was apparent that the audience needed education concerning the Bitcoin, to digest the information given and clear up in their minds the methodology of procedures to create public confidence in this new financial world of processing, as well as, understand in their minds its advantages compared to the traditional way of the Banks performing our daily needs.
