
We therefore wish you all the best in England and hope you find a local Rotary Club where your knowledge and expertise would be greatly appreciated I'm sure.

Message from President Katerina for 2011-2012

Fellow Rotarians,

Rotary is about service, it's about giving, and a person who joins Rotary does so, not because he has something to gain, but because he has something to give. Not because he thinks that by brushing shoulders with the pillars of our community it will improve his career or his status, but because in this world today of crisis, of strife, hunger and poverty, we who are privileged enough to live here in Cyprus can say "Yes thank you God. Thank you for I have a home, I have work and food on the table, I can feed my family and educate my children and I have a little spare bit of myself left to give to others".

So fellow Rotarians, I want you all to think back to your idealistic days when you first joined this club to serve, and time was not so much of a luxury, and I want you all this year, to give a little of yourselves, give a little of your time, your talents, your expertise, to your club. We are a band of friends with different professions, backgrounds, ages, but together we form a small but strong link (a small rotary family) which is part of a larger chain, a larger family of 1.6million Rotarians around the world, with a compassionate enthusiasm and commitment to make this world a better place. I just looked at them and said – "Well what did you put in, in order to get something out." I'm not sure they really understood my meaning but I'm sure you do.
