My dear brothers and sisters in Rotary,

June is a time to reflect on the Rotary year that has nearly passed, and to look forward to the one that is soon to begin. We look back at what we have accomplished and measure our progress toward the goals we have set for ourselves. In Rotary, we may pause to reflect, but never to rest on our laurels – for as much as we have achieved, we are always aware of how much there is still to do.

The 2011-12 year has been a time of significant progress. Binota and I have been fortunate to have visited different parts of the Rotary world and seen the many ways that Rotarians everywhere *Reach Within to Embrace Humanity*. In South Sudan, we met with Rotarians who are determined to make a difference despite tremendous challenges. The humanitarian problems in that nation are enormous, and begin with the most basic: At the moment, South Sudan lacks a single functional hospital. I am confident that in the coming year, Rotarians around the world will reach out to our newest Rotary country with the support and help it will need.

In Uganda, I was delighted and heartened to discover how many government ministers and officials are Rotarians, and to see them bringing the ideals of Rotary to life in their service. In Kathmandu, I was overwhelmed as countries of South Asia – Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, the Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka – came together to vow to make the region 100 per cent literate by 2017.

In Fiji and Vanuatu in the South Pacific, I was moved by Rotarians who are helping to lower child mortality and provide safe housing. In Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, I was delighted by the statement of Sheikh Nahayan Mubarak Al-Nahayan, minister of higher education and scientific research: "We are looking forward eagerly to Rotary starting its first club here." And in Valdivia, Chile, as close to the South Pole as Binota and I have been, we were moved by Rotarians' work with children who have mental disabilities.

But most of all, we found our hearts warmed by the welcome we received all over the world – and by the sight of so many Rotarians living the Rotary ideal, and choosing to *Reach Within to Embrace Humanity*. I thank you for the opportunity to serve as your president, and look forward to working together to build *Peace Through Service*.

The Rotary Club of Nicosia-Salamis has successfully completed for a fourth consecutive year its Road Safety Campaign with the motto

The campaign was conducted on **Sunday 6th May 2012** at the weighing stations on the Nicosia-Limassol motorway with the cooperation of the Road Safety Department of the Ministry of Communications & Works, the Motor Vehicles Inspection Station (MVI) and the Automotive Technology Center (ATC), as well Cosmos Insurance Company which was the sponsor.



Hundreds of vehicles voluntarily went through an inspection performed by members of the MVI and ATC to determine whether their tyres were in a good condition and whether their lights and indicators were working properly, whilst members of the Rotary Club of Nicosia-Salamis distributed to the drivers and passengers leaflets with road safety rules and with information about Rotary.

##### General Declaration of Principles

Our District 2450 remains unique with its large geographical coverage in several countries and continents, embracing different Cultures, Languages and Creeds.

From where we stand in one of the hottest areas in the World, we Rotarians of D2450 cannot remain untouched by the events around us. We cannot forget that one of the main objectives of Rotary is the Promotion of World Understanding and Peace.

As Rotarians of D2450, we call upon R.I. to support and affirm the importance of the implementation of ALL UN Security Council Resolutions without any exception or amendment.

We call upon R.I. to confirm the legitimacy of the UN as the unique legitimate arm for Conflict Solving.

We call upon the UN to adopt a single and unbiased measure in the implementation of its own Resolutions.

We wish that R.I. could deploy more effort to see that peace and justice for all will prevail.

#### 5. COMING DISTRICT GOVERNORS

This Conference endorses the Nominating Committee's following nominations:

#### 6. DISTRICT DUES MATTERS

- District Fund:** for 2012-13: The conference approved the District Fund submitted by IDG Kevork Mahdessian at the per capita levy of \$11.
- District Magazine:** for 2012-13: The conference approved the District Magazine fees submitted by IDG Kevork Mahdessian at the per capita fees of \$8.

- d. **Interact Fees:** Conference to approve the fees of \$100 per Interact Club to be paid by the sponsoring Rotary Club and to be administered by the District Governor financial committee.
- e. **Egypt Country Fund:** conference ratified the recommendation made by the Egyptian Clubs Assembly to set their Country fund at 106 Egypt Pounds per capita, to be settled at the beginning of the year starting 2012-13

**7. District Magazine**

It is noted with satisfaction that the District magazine has published 5 issues so far during this current year. A word of thanks is extended to the executive board, contributing editors, technical staff and support, magazine correspondents, advertisers, sponsors and contributing clubs, urging all clubs to contribute actively in advertising in the magazine. It is approved that 25% of advertising revenue received through clubs, will be returned to clubs as a fundraising to their projects.

**8. ELECTION OF A MEMBER TO THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE FOR DIRECTOR**

The conference elected PDG Doros Jeropoulos to represent the district for the Nominating committee for Director 2014-16, and PDG Assem Abel Razek as an alternate member and to advise RI of this resolution.

**9. Election of District-Governor Nominee 2014-15.**

It is resolved that the election of the District-Nominee for District 2452 for the year 2014-15 shall be using the nominating committee method, composed of the last seven Past District Governors plus the current governor and the incoming Governor all being active members from that district.

**10. COMMITMENT TO YOUTH.**

Youth and the New Generations symbolize our hopes, dreams and aspirations. Rotarians are increasing their long time service to Youth through Projects that address Illiteracy, Hunger Drug Abuse and Homelessness. Rotarians have an obligation to do whatever it takes to make life better for them, taking care of our Youth is essential if the world is to become a home for all its people.

The conference thanks both Past District Governors responsible for these statements requesting that future financial statements to be submitted as per RI Manual of procedures.


